Science

Write invisible letters for someone to find and read around your house.

- First, pour the lemon juice into your small bowl. Then, dip the cotton swab into the bowl and use it to write your secret message on the white construction paper.
- As you write or draw, you'll see the juice begin to fade as your message seeps into the construction paper.
- Once you're done, use your blow dryer on low speed to see your

	message come back to life! If you use freshly squeezed lemon juice, your message will turn brown. If you use Lemon juice from a bottle, your message will become visible when held up to the light. To keep the fun going, try experimenting with different fruit juices or other liquids you could find in the kitchen (like milk or vinegar!) and see how the message clarity compares to your lemon juice message!

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


